

A FEW WORDS FROM FR. JOE.....

I spent Wednesday at the Pastoral Congress in the RDS. Heading over to Ballsbridge on the 18 bus I was apprehensive. There had been such a lot of coverage in the media, much of it critical, and yet the programme looked very interesting, diverse and inclusive, not quite the agenda for a right wing gathering. I knew that the preparation, choice of speakers, selection of presiders and homilists at Mass had been going on for three years and yes I was aware that in the three days before the event some last minute changes had been made. I knew to expect a wide range of talks and seminars, about 30 in all, and that choices would have to be made. I thought that there would be a lot of exhibits, stalls and shops in the main hall, plenty of places to grab a sandwich or coffee and then that the Mass would be in Leinster's home ground, the RDS arena. All that turned out as expected. What I didn't know going in was who I might meet. Former parishioners, the Chair of our own Pastoral Council, parishioners from Rathgar and Clonskeagh, priest classmates and Catholics from all over the world. It was almost impossible to make progress around the RDS there were so many reasons to stop and chat, meet and greet, share and celebrate. The main talk in the morning was by Cardinal Tagle from the Philippines, he spoke about the "throw away, disposable culture" and offered a fantastic reflection on human relationships which endure and sustain us. For me the highlight of the day was the international Mass, we all know how universal the Church is, but it's only when you sit among a congregation, vast and diverse, gathered from all the ends of the earth, that it feels so real. I headed home exhausted and had food with the French family who I am hosting, and from a totally different perspective they too had an enriching and enjoyable day. Yes there is a lot to be improved in the Church, but reflecting on this one day there is much to celebrate and applaud. Welcome Pope Francis!
