Prayer in Time of Bereavement *Let us Pray...*



Lord, you are close to the broken-hearted.

A few words from Fr Joe......

I remember my dad coming home from the funeral of an elderly nun and saying what a happy celebration it had been. Knowing that death and funerals were sad occasions, I was puzzled and asked him what made this moment joyful. He thought about it for a moment and then said it was the confidence of the nuns that their sister would go straight to heaven that made it so uplifting for him; he was moved by their trust in God's mercy and love. I guess this woman, who lived a long life devoted to prayer and service as a religious, had to struggle with her own weaknesses and doubts. She might not always have felt God's unconditional love for her; she perhaps doubted whether she would deserve heaven's joys and maybe she had a little fear of purgatory or hell fire. It is a very rare thing to meet someone who is perfect, without their doubts, without sin, a living saint.

For all of us, the month of November is a time to remember our dead and to pray for them. We would like to think that all our deceased relatives and friends are at peace with God in heaven and there enjoy eternal rest. The promise of Jesus to his followers is that he will lose nothing of all that the Father has given to him, and that where he is gone we can hope to follow. We can't earn a place in heaven simply by our own efforts, but all that we do in response to God's love; all our faithful following of God's law; service of His people; all our prayer and worship builds confidence that we will come one day to that resting place with angels and the saints and live for ever with our God.

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
