A Very Warm Welcome!

This weekend at our Mass we celebrate the 'Do This In **Memory Programme'** for this year's 1st Holy Communion Classes. A few words from Fr Joe.....

Last weekend Pope Francis sat down to a lunch of Lasagne and salad with over 1000 people in the Vatican. It wasn't a state banquet for a visiting dignitary but rather a shared meal with the poor of Rome. Above all Pope Francis is a pastor, Bishop of Rome, and a friend of the poor.

He has already had showers and washing machines installed near St Peter's Square for people who live on the streets to come in and use when they wish. This month in St Peter's Square a temporary clinic has been erected and there were lovely pictures published of the Holy Father walking across the square from his residence to meet the patients and encourage the medical staff there. These are all small, but significant actions. I guess they are designed to draw attention to the ministry to the poor that is essential to every Christian life. Perhaps some dioceses and parishes and individual Catholic families will be motivated to renew their charitable efforts and find new ways to reach out to the poor. Some will imitate the Pope and arrange meals and medical care, others will carry on the multitude of pastoral services in the sure and certain knowledge that their work is valued and appreciated. Locally in Dublin and here in our parish, care of the poor is our common task.

The St Vincent De Paul Society gives us one way of reaching out and day by day, as we move into Advent, we will no doubt see and respond to many charitable requests. We are all reminded if the words of the Lord, "When you did this for the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did it for me."
