A few words from Fr. Joe

The image of the spire falling into the inferno that was Notre Dame took up half the front page of most newspapers on Tuesday.

If you look closely at this image you can see the cross that was on top of the spire had broken away, falling, and it too was consumed by fire moments later. This was happening in the week when all our churches call the faithful to come together to pray around the Cross, to accept the gift of the Eucharist and to celebrate the Risen Lord. Easter has now begun and for 50 days we will pray together in light of the Resurrection of our Lord. His tomb is empty, the disciples meet him in the garden, in the upper room, on the shores of the Sea of Galilee.

They begin to realise that his teaching about resurrection was true, that God had acted powerfully and that with the gift of the Spirit they will be a church, a community of believers that will tell this story from one generation to the next. Believers build churches, small ones in mud and wattle, big ones in brick and stone. Artists and gifted people are commissioned to help the building tell the story, in art, in glass, in wood carved and stone chiselled.

These buildings become our spiritual home, where God is worshipped and the parish nourished. All our churches are special, they need support and the prayerful presence of God's holy people. Paris makes that local reality a global truth.

Happy Easter everyone and thanks for all you do to make this church precious.
