A Few Words from Fr Joe.....

A parishioner stopped me for a moment last Sunday on the way into Mass. It was a hot, humid morning, and I do admit to wishing we could stay outdoors. 'Father Joe' she said, 'you should be saying Mass in the park, it's packed!' I guess she was struck by the energy, the joy and the activities on the playing fields and comparing that to the small numbers in the church itself. There is no doubt that those in the community committed to sport put huge effort into their Sunday mornings. So many clubs, coaches, mentors, parents and kids get up and out at weekends to participate in sport. This in itself is wonderful and to be admired and appreciated. Naturally for those of us with a church and parish orientation there can be a conflict of scheduling and intention.

Another woman, after a meeting, mentioned to me that her husband had gone back to Mass last weekend for the first time since Covid. He had said to her, 'I heard the bells and thought right it's time to go', and he went! He also commented on the small numbers present, and no doubt we have many fewer at Mass now compared to before 2019.

A third woman, in her late 30's, talked to me about her mother's faith, regular attendance at Mass and explained that her mum really valued this time in the quiet and tranquillity of the church, switched off from all her activities and tuned into her spiritual journey, precious time.

So, we can identify three different groups within the parish faith community, the young sport orientated kids and their families who are busy at weekends, and the older Covid cautious parishioners who haven't returned yet, and those who are regularly present at our Masses.

I imagine that we all want to encourage, promote and embrace attendance at Sunday Mass. We cherish gathering with the community to pray and worship God, to encounter Jesus as we hear the Word and receive the Eucharist. At Mass, we are invited to respond to the needs of the community and hear about the life and activities of the parish, to meet and know each other, and the priests. In this way, we are church alive and faithful disciples.
