A Few Words from Fr Joe.....

People sometimes ask me what's it like looking after a partnership of three parishes? I tend to say it's great, you can get up every day and choose whether to deal with a problem, there's always at least one, or go to a very positive and engaging pastoral task with a parishioner, a school, a liturgy or with the staff.

Last Sunday was such an enjoyable day in ministry for me. I started in Clonskeagh with the excellent 10.30am Choir Mass followed by 3 baptisms. Then in addition to that I had the pleasure of meeting and greeting the Ukrainian Orthodox community who had come to celebrate their Mass in St Joseph's Oratory. This being their very first time to be with us meant members of the faith community had travelled from all over Ireland to be with their priest, his wife and child, the deacon and organisers. They packed out the oratory, their incense and chanting definitely added to the spiritual energy. There was no fear of the parishioners moving over to the Orthodox Mass after I pointed out that it began at 9.00am and finished three hours later at midday! The warmth of welcome from our community matched their absolute delight in finding a sacred space to gather, pray and meet each other. An unforgettable moment.

Then later in the day I met the newly elected chair of the St Laurence's Parish Pastoral Council. A wonderful new beginning for Kilmacud Parish with a highly committed and talented group of people taking on co-responsibility for their parish in the spirit of the Synod and Building Hope. We all wish them well for the next 3 years.

Finally, I came to Mount Merrion for the evening Mass. Not only was the church packed for the Confirmation Classes Commitment ceremony but a brand-new music group sang for the first time. It was so uplifting to see more than a dozen adults with their Choir Director rehearse and sing at the liturgy and to learn that they are committed to do this every fortnight until next summer.

So, while we all see decline, falling numbers and change in the church, it was uplifting to see all this new life. One woman described it as green shoots breaking through the concrete!
