Seeing Your Life Through The Lens of The Gospel – Twentieth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Pathways Adult Faith Formation Programme

Have you ever wanted to know more about your faith? Are you looking for a course that can help you grow in your ministry? **Pathways** is an Adult Faith formation programme run by the Archdiocese aimed at all adults, members of PPCs and those in parish ministry. It is a 2 year course running on Thursday evenings from September to May (excluding holidays) from 7pm-9.30pm in DCU, Drumcondra, Dublin 9.

Each evening includes a presentation on the topic as well as small group sharing and discussion and there is no written work or assessments.
