
### A few words from Fr Joe.....

Four years ago we were very excited to welcome Fr Donie O'Connor to our parish partnership as a full time curate. Fr Donie had extensive pastoral ministry in Africa and brought his own unique and special gift for ministry here. Donie settled in very quickly and became a familiar figure around the parish with his Kerry accent, broad smile, huge heart and engaging personality. He presided at Mass with a warm and inclusive style, he brought huge comfort to the bereaved at funerals and entertained the young people at every school liturgy. He encouraged good music at Mass and guided the work of the Parish Pastoral Council. He became a valued colleague to all of us who work here and always lifted our spirits with his sense of fun.

Earlier this year Donie got the upsetting news of the terminal diagnosis received by his brother Tim. He felt called to go and spend time supporting and comforting Tim and his family and remained with them during the final illness, death and funeral. Since then Donie has found it hard to regain his energy and his capacity for full time ministry as he was drained and exhausted. Now in consultation with his leadership team at the Mill Hill Missionaries in Rathgar he is withdrawing from his parish appointment here. No doubt this is very hard for him but it is also a wise decision. With his religious community, he can have the support and care that will help him regain what he has lost. There is no doubt that God has plans for another chapter in Fr Donie's life and ministry. We all join in saying a huge thank you to Donie for all that he has done and shared with us and to wish him health and happiness.

Fr Peter Johnson who has been attached to Kilmacud Parish during his studies here in Ireland has offered to remain with us in the coming year. Fr Peter will be able to take on most of Fr Donie's responsibilities and with his assistance we can continue to provide our current level of pastoral care. We are grateful to Fr Peter for staying on.
