Commissioning of the Dublin Diocesan Pastoral Council

Last weekend, on **Lay Ministry Sunday**, the Diocesan Pastoral Council was commissioned by Bishop Donal Roche in St Mary's Pro Cathedral. Parish Pastoral Councils (PPCs), made up of a representative group of lay people with their priests, are well established across the diocese now. They, and Partnership Pastoral Councils, help to provide a sense of direction to parish life and ministry, through prayerful reflection and planning for the needs and priorities of the parish/partnership of parishes.

The Diocesan Pastoral Council will play a similar role, but for the whole diocese. It will advise the Archbishop on pastoral initiatives for the diocese into the future. The membership is made up of mostly lay participants who were chosen after a lengthy process of discernment in Deaneries and Pastoral Areas over the past year, in order to reflect the entire population of the diocese; rural and urban, young and older, male and female - people of prayer, who are actively involved in various ministries around the diocese.
