A Few Words from Fr Joe.....

I am struggling to accept that it is August 1st on Tuesday. Here we are half way through the summer holidays and somehow it feels too soon to be thinking about how quickly they will come to their natural end. In Ireland, we typically have two great spells of fine weather, one in June when the exams are on and another in the weeks after the children go back to school. Certainly, July has been an unusually wet month, so well done for enduring all the showers and daily rain, let's hope for better days to come, maybe an Indian Summer.

The move into August shifts my focus to where our effort and energy will go when everything is up and running again. I'm conscious that Fr Paddy's retirement is another pointer along the road of changing times. We are still struggling to accept that fewer priests really is a sign of the times and that we are being called into what Pope Francis calls 'a new era.' The word that expresses our common task is coresponsibility, where priests and laity truly share the burden of stimulating the mission of the church and life of the parish.

At the installation of the new minister in St Brigid's recently there was a sense that his pledge was to serve, with whatever talent, energy and pastoral skills are at his disposal and that the parishioners reciprocated with their personal commitment to give support, not to help him, but to be fully active and fulfil their side of contract.

For us the challenge is in creating and involving a new generation of faithful parishioners. Somehow, we have to discern what sort of parish life will engage with their faith journey, their family life, their sense of community, church and culture.
