
Dublin Diocesan Pilgrimage to Lourdes

Death of Mgr Peter Briscoe

We heard the sad news this week that the death has occurred of

Mgr Peter Briscoe, Administrator in Milltown Parish.

Mgr Peter was ordained a priest in 1973 by Archbishop Ryan. Following ordination he studied at the École Biblique in Jerusalem. He was appointed curate in Haddington Road in 1975. In 1978 Mgr Peter joined the staff of Holy Cross College, Clonliffe. He became vice-president of the College before serving as president from 1989 to 2000. He was subsequently parish priest first in Sandymount, then moderator in Malahide, Yellow Walls, Kinsealy and Portmarnock, and more recently administrator in Milltown.

Please pray at this time for Mgr Peter’s family and friends and for those he worked with during his ministry in the Archdiocese of Dublin.
