

## A Few Words from Fr Joe.....

I was in Cavan at Mass for the Feast of the Assumption last Tuesday morning. The Church was bright and welcoming and had been fully renovated in recent years. In the half hour before Mass began people began to gather and at 11.15am a parishioner led the rosary and all present joined in. As Mass time drew near a variety of people moved around getting things ready, putting out books and baskets, mics, water and wine and all was ready. Just a few minutes before Mass a priest arrived in through the side door, carrying his vestments in a brown leather bag, obviously a visitor, covering the parish priest's holiday. He then had a quick check around and when the bell rang he processed in and the organ struck up "As I kneel before you...." I sang with gusto and then a little more quietly as there didn't seem to be too much congregational participation.

The Mass was lovely, but a bit chaotic, one of the altar candles, a terrible oil filled plastic version, flickered and went out before the Mass started and remained a dead wick for the whole Mass. The book on the altar hadn't been set and the poor priest fumbled back and forth to find the right prayers for the Feast day. The reader was superb and proclaimed the Word with skill and confidence. There was a collection, but no sign of peace. During the homily the retired missionary priest lamented the changes in Ireland, and made special mention of how parents have just stopped bringing their children to Church. This annoyed me as Messi, Kane and Mbappe were emblazoned on the shirts of the three boys in front of me and in total I counted 18 children present, with either parents or grandparents praying beside them.

At the end of Mass the priest recalled how this day, August 15<sup>th</sup> had been a great holiday in the village when he was young and he made special mention of the joys of ice cream which was a highlight of the day and even mentioned how they as children knew which shops gave the biggest portions. Then just before the blessing, and the 'Go in peace' he reminded us all that the world lives under the constant threat of the Atomic bomb and nuclear destruction, WOW!

This experience reminded me of how it can be in a parish when the local priest in on holidays and relief clergy are hard to find. In my home parish, last Saturday evening the congregation were sent home as the visiting priest didn't appear. Little by little the community will need to prepare to take on responsibility for these moments and perfect the lay led prayer.
