A Few Words from Fr Joe.....

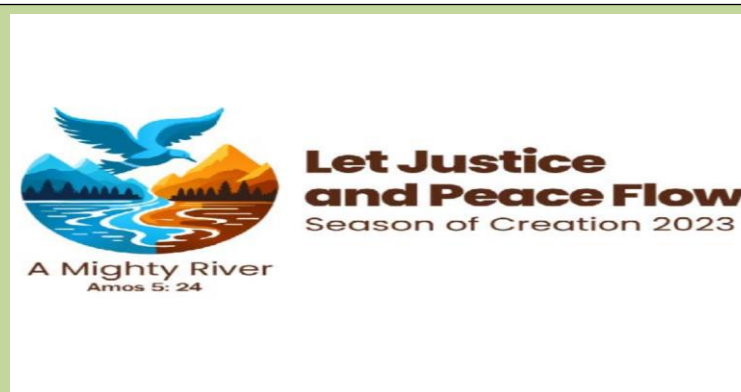
