A Few Words from Fr Joe

I went to see the movie Conclave, just after Christmas, in

Dundrum. The cinema was packed and the whole audience seemed engrossed in the fictional tale of the election of Pope Innocent. It was a beautiful visual movie, using a replica of the Sistine Chapel, built specially in CineCitta studios just outside Rome as the setting for the election. I was mesmerised by the lines of red clad cardinals processing in and out of the sessions, all intertwined in the task of electing a Pope. There were of course all sorts of shenanigans going on, with different factions favouring one candidate for his leaning into the view of church that they held trenchantly. Tensions arose, past sins were revealed and yet little by little they moved towards a consensus candidate and in the end, white smoke marked the end of their discernment and the beginning of a new, fictional papacy. Many who saw the film were given cause to wonder if what was presented in the movie may soon be played out in real life. Now it has come to pass that the death of our beloved Pope Francis prompts the cardinals to gather on Wednesday in conclave and begin the sacred task of election. The Superior General of the Jesuits was heard to say in an interview that the task of the cardinals is not to elect a successor to Francis, but rather a successor to St Peter. Indeed, this is true, they will be guided to ask of one of their number to take on the enormous task of filling the shoes of the fisherman, the one Jesus called and entrusted the leadership of His church on earth. The cardinals have asked for our prayers to support them in the days ahead. Perhaps by next Sunday we will know the name of the man, and the name he takes as our new Pope. Whoever it is we wish him well and promise our fidelity to his teaching and guidance. May the Spirit who works in mysterious ways guide the deliberations and empower the one selected.
