A Few Words from Fr Joe.....

Last week I spent a few days down in Waterford and Wexford playing golf with some priest friends. The weather was spectacular, everyone we met was in such good form and we all really enjoyed being on holiday in Ireland. As priests, we are all aware of the demands we and the church are making on people to adapt to the changes that are happening all around us. We have all had to amend Mass times, rationalising the number of services and ask people to modify their behaviour, maybe to travel to a different church for Mass, or accept and lead, a Service instead. During the week, we ourselves were also learning a little lesson about modifying behaviour in the light of the weather. When we are away we have a pretty set pattern for the day, breakfast at 9.00, golf at 11.30, tea and a scone when we come in at 4.00, and then dinner at 8.00pm. Needless to say the golf was booked months in advance to secure the preferred tee time. Now what about adapting to the weather? It was almost 30 degrees on Tuesday and Wednesday, with the worst of the heat in the early afternoon. To be honest we were baked! So, the question is, did we change anything to help us cope with the conditions? The answer, no, nothing at all. We all still had our rain gear and umbrellas in the golf bags, just in case! We played at the preferred time, when it would have made more sense to play early or later in the day. One of us wore shorts, the others exactly the same clothes as normal, and we each carried just one bottle of water.
